There were 12 terminals around the Bay Area hooked up to an old SDS mainframe by modem. The project had a catchy name. **Community Memory**.

It inspired me to get into computers.

Another boost came along at just the right time. [The Altair](#) [2]. It came out not long after my return from **Resource One**.

By '79 I had designed the I/O board that went into the world's first BBS. Fun times.

Which brings up today's community memory which is a whole lot larger. It is engineering oriented and has a simple but extensive help page.
